I have the honour to submit herewith the Thirtieth Report of The Liquor Control Board of Ontario for the twelve month fiscal period which ended the 31st of March 1956.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Balance Sheet has been certified to by the Auditors of the Board, Messrs. Dick, Bond, Hetherington & O'Loane, Chartered Accountants.

Current assets totalling \$28,921,948.24 consisted of the following:

Prepaid charges for insurance, rentals, etc. amounted to 40,373.47

The amount of fixed assets of \$506,587.25 represents the cost value, less depreciation of \$12,169,012.37 of the real estate, together with all furniture, fixtures, machinery and equipment and leasehold improvements in stores, warehouses and offices. The real estate consists of lands and buildings situated at 55 Fleet Street East, Toronto; land and warehouse at 210 Victoria Avenue, Fort William; and land and store buildings at 28 Silver Street, Cobalt.

Current liabilities of the Board totalled \$2,626,605.41 and were as follows:

The Confiscated Stock item represents a balance due for forfeited liquor which was purchased by the Board after analytical examination and in accordance with the provisions of Section 116(2) of The Act. The Transfer fees liability represents amounts deposited as Transfer fees with the Board by sundry licencees whose transfer of ownership had not been approved by The Liquor Licence Board as of March 31, 1956.

The Reserve for Insurance of \$1,000,000.00 remained the same as that of the previous year. The Reserve for contingencies of \$3,000,000.00 was increased by \$1,500,000.00 over the amount as at the close of the previous year. This Reserve is set up for the purchase of land for future retail stores, warehouses and the securing of existing stores which, in the opinion of the Board, it is desirous of purchasing.

After all the Board's transactions had been recorded, a Surplus was shown of \$22,842,303.55. Conforming with the procedure of previous years, the portion of Surplus represented by Accounts Receivable, Inventories, Prepaid Charges and Net Fixed Assets amounting to \$16,836,793.82 has been shown separately as Appropriated Surplus. The remainder of \$6,005,509.73 being available for transfer to the Provincial Treasurer appears on the Balance Sheet as Unappropriated Surplus.

Contingent liabilities amounted to \$13,126,498.19. These items represent the value of undelivered orders totalling \$10,001,636.90 and the amount of \$3,124,861.29 for Customs and Excise Duties which are payable on the goods which were in bond in the warehouse on March 31, 1956. These contingent liabilities have no reflection on the trading profits of the Board.

The Profit and Loss Account shows that sales for the 12 months of spirits, wines and beer from Liquor Control Board stores amounted to \$128,273,626.01.

The same account shows a gross trading profit of \$48,449,191.91 with total expenses and depreciation totalling \$9,987,437.60 which resulted in a net trading profit of \$38,461,754.31. The amount shown as other revenue of \$13,744,215.58 was derived from permit sales, fees, taxes on brewers and wine manufacturers and their products, from licence holders' fees and from fines. The increase of \$1,500,000.00 in the Reserve for Contingencies previously mentioned is shown as a charge against income. The net income carried forward to the Surplus Account is \$50,705,969.89. The expenses incurred by The Liquor Licence Board amounting to \$560,679.94 are included in the total expense amount.

For comparative purposes, the percentage that the cost of stock sold, expenses and other revenue bear to the sales are given for the fiscal year 1954-1955 and the 12 month period reported upon herein.

A statement showing the expenses of administration and operation for the twelve months is also attached. Individual percentages in comparison to the total sales are given for the 12 months and also for the preceding fiscal period. On March 31, 1956, the staff of The Liquor Control Board and The Liquor Licence Board numbered 1790 employees, 140 of these being part-time or seasonally employed, compared with 1744 permanent and 133 part-time at the previous year-end.

All Liquor Control Board stores, brewers' retail stores, breweries and wineries from which alcoholic beverages are sold in Ontario as of March 31, 1956, are listed on Schedule I, and a classification of permits and licenses issued appears on Schedule II.

SALES

The sale of spirits, beer and wine from liquor stores during the 12 months amounted to \$128,273,626.01. The net value of beer sold from breweries and brewers' retail stores, exclusive of any charge for containers, totalled \$144,643,010.50. Sales of Canadian Wine made direct to customers from licenced Ontario wine sales offices and, where permitted, from winery premises, amounted to \$5,384,894.55.

As shown previously in this report, the Board paid to The Provincial Treasurer the sum of \$50,700,000.00 on account of profits, licence fees, etc. The Board also created a liability for payments to the various municipalities of a proportion of the fees received from licencees, such amount totalling \$863,372.93, which was distributed to 254 municipalities.

Additional to the above payments made by the Board, the Dominion Government received \$39,695,578.62 during the course of the year in Customs and Excise duties and \$6,692,062.52 for sales tax on spirits, wines and imported beers purchased by the Board.

The Dominion Government also received approximately \$50,000,000.00 for malt duties and taxes on domestic beers and wines sold in Ontario, the total aggregating approximately \$96,000,000.00.

Therefore, the grand total of revenue payments received by the respective Dominion, Provincial and Municipal Governments was approximately \$148,000,000.00 as a result of levies on alcoholic beverages sold in Ontario during the year. This amount was exclusive of Dominion Corporation and Municipal Realty taxes paid by the respective manufacturers and licence holders.

On March 31, 1956, there were 22 Ontario and 4 Quebec breweries licensed to sell their products in Ontario. One new Ontario brewery, Molson's Brewery (Ontario) Limited, 640 Fleet Street West, Toronto, opened on May 16, 1955, and

one new Quebec brewery, John Labatt Limited, Ville La Salle, opened on February 8, 1956.

All brands of beer produced by the Ontario breweries and by the Quebec breweries which were sold in this Province were periodically analyzed, as in pre-

vious years, thus ensuring that beer sold in Ontario is in conformity with the Regulations passed pursuant to The Food and Drugs Act of Canada.

The Board receives from its laboratory at the Toronto Warehouse current analytical reports of all brands of spirits, wine and beer.

WINERIES

The number of wineries operating in the Province remained at 12, there being no changes in number during the year.

HOME-MADE WINE PERMITS

Regulations which became effective January 1, 1940 require that any person manufacturing more than 100 gallons of home-made wine must obtain a permit from the Board. Four were issued during the year ended March 31, 1956, with the result that 1536 permits were issued and in force.

PERMITS

A total of 979,313 individual annual liquor permits were issued for the year ending March 31, 1956. Individual permits sold to non-residents, valid for a period not exceeding one month, numbered 125,730. In addition, 1,348 special permits were issued to physicians, druggists, hospitals, etc.

Special permits totalling 519 were issued to druggists during the year, their purpose being to allow druggists to purchase limited quantities of spirits for compounding medicine or for use as a solvent or preservative. They were also permitted to buy rubbing alcohol for resale.
