

FACTS and FIGURES 2013

Each year, benefits are indexed by the appropriate indexing factor. For 2013:

- the general indexing factor (Modified Friedland or MF) has been set at 0.5%, as per the prescribed temporary indexing factor to provide fairer compensation for injured workers whose benefits have not kept pace with inflation, and
- the alternate-indexing factor (Consumer Price Index or CPI) is set at 1.8%.

In the first two columns, you will find the section of the WSIA and the legislated dollar amount under that section. In the third, you will find the indexed amount for 2013. For more information about indexing, please refer to 18-01-02, Benefit Dollar Amounts - Accidents from 1998, and 18-01-03, Benefit Dollar Amounts - Accidents before 1998, in the *Operational Policy* manual.

2013 Table of Rates

Every year, the WSIB reviews and sets the following rates after conducting an external survey of costs for each specific rate. The exceptions to this are

- the minimum burial rate which is indexed annually according to the alternate-indexing factor, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which is 1.8% for 2013, and
- the hearing aid rate which the WSIB regularly reviews and sets based on relevant information gathered from internal and external sources.

The rates apply as of January 1, 2013.
